ORGANIC BIODYNAMIC PRACTICES

Organic practices but not certified

6 hectares

Vineyards located in the Pradis area, the warmest region of Colli

SOIL DETAILS

Ponca, a combination of marl and sandstones with traces of marine fossils

Friulano, Ribolla Gialla, Malvasia, Pinot Bianco, Merlot

FERMENTATION PRACTICES

Temperature controlled fermentation in stainless steel, concrete and tonneaux

YEAST UTILIZED

Spontaneous fermentation with wild yeasts

FILTRATION STABILIZATION

Light filtration and cold stabilization

FERMENTATION & AGING VESSELS

All wines undergo temperature controlled fermentation and aging in a combination of stainless steel and cement, 15% in neutral French tonneaux, Rosso aged in old barrique



ADDITIONAL NOTES

WINEMAKING STYLE

Andrea takes a very natural and hands-off approach to winemaking and allows for all of his wines to remain on the lees for the entirety of their life in barrel and tank.

WINES PRODUCED

Friulano, Pinot Bianco, Malvasia, Ribolla Gialla, Collio Vino da Uve Autoctone, Decimo, Merlot

TOTAL PRODUCTION

Depending on the vintage, roughly 30-35,000 bottles are produced each year
